2 The evolution of workspaces, hotels, restaurants, outdoor and home

Until today, the **design of offices** has led us to the creation of **open and flexible spaces** with **common areas** that allow for the socialization and interaction of teams. All of them have sought an **aesthetic close to that of the home**, with **unassigned spaces (hot-desking)** and **coworking areas to generate maximum synergies**.

Workspaces



Hotels

In these spaces, the user's **experience**, **safety** and **well-being** have been prioritized, indicating a major change in the **selection of furniture**, materials and **finishes**, with the choice of **hygienic** and easily maintained and cleaned **materials**, in addition to a greater demand for **sustainable design**.



Restaurants

In these spaces, the customer **experience** and **safety** prevail, with more **intimate**, safe and **flexible** environments that offer added value with the incorporation of **separation elements**, the creation of circulation areas and **resistant**, safe, **hygienic** and **timeless furnishings**.



Outdoor

The creation of exterior spaces and the incorporation of **biophilia** to increase the **connection** with the **natural** world join the request for these new outdoor spaces where the choice of **versatile** and flexible **furniture**, **resistant** to outdoor use and easy **cleaning**, prevails.



Home

At home, the **home office** plays a special role. Its design must be done paying attention to aspects such as the **lighting**, **soundproofing** and **ventilation** of the space. In regard to the furniture, you should look for an **ergonomic** and **functional** work chair as well as a **custom** work **table** with integrated **connectivity** allowing you to work comfortably.

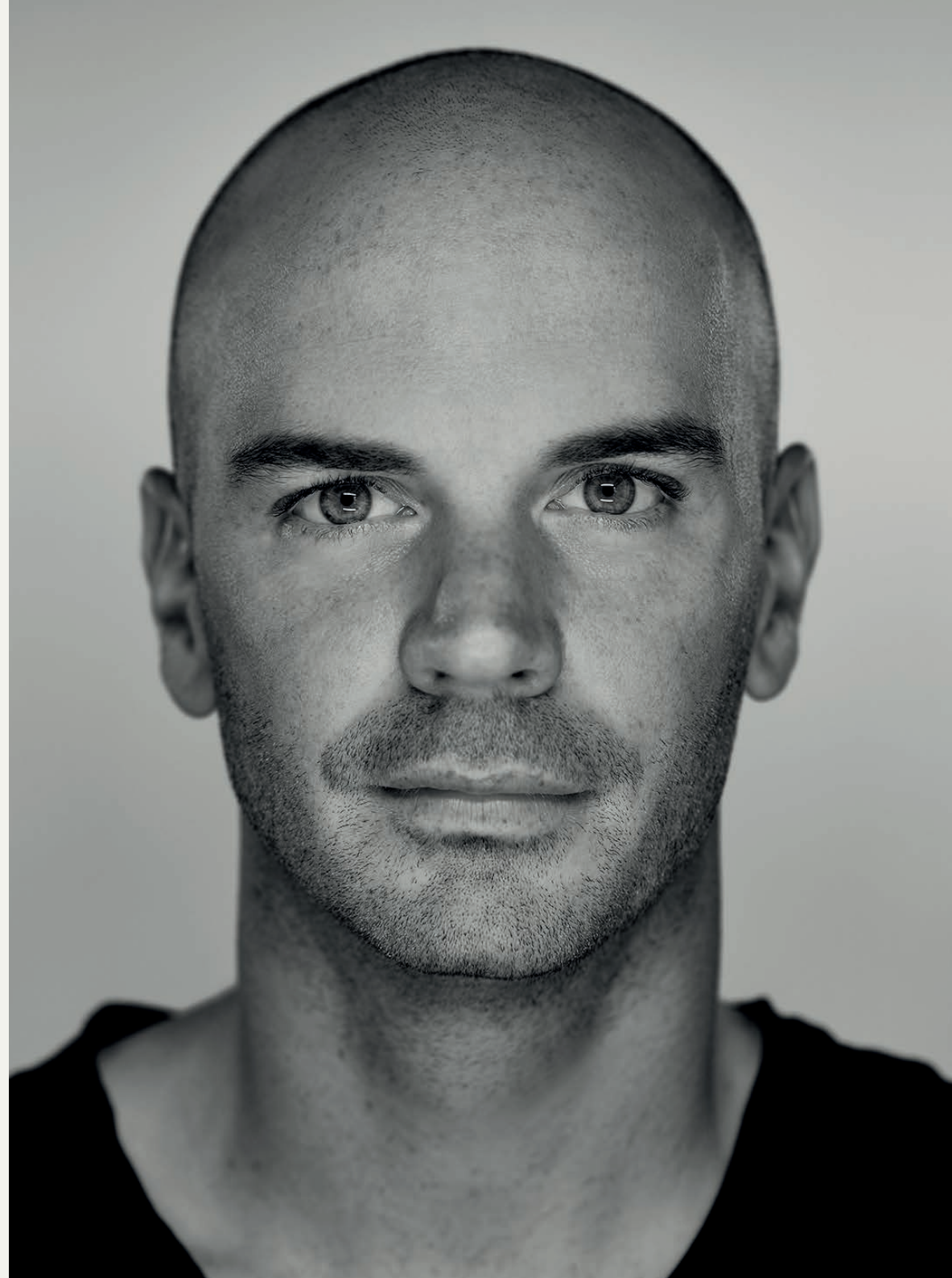
“As a designer, I have high hopes and I am firmly convinced that **jobs and workplaces will be even more important.**

I believe that new projects will surely have a low environmental impact and they will be designed to contribute to creating a more pleasant condition of the space dedicated to work. For this, the **raw materials** used will be from renewable and recyclable sources. In addition, maximum attention must also be paid to the ideal quality and the production cycle. During **confinement**, we have continued to work remotely, experiencing new ways of working for the first time. Working from home, discovering, in each one of them, new creative, concentrated and organizational qualities. Hence the sensation of creating new places and projects that will have to offer this opportunity. To this end, **new projects** should be customizable to allow the user to create a space that makes them feel comfortable. “

“For me, the result of these times will be in **practical life**, to understand and practice, alternating **digital and physical dialogues**. Both are very important, since, for us, culturally it is and will be important to have **‘live’ dialogues** and debates.

We will need more defined and expanded spaces and areas in offices and hotels, while at home we will have a **desk to work intelligently**.

The **real growth** of digital is to teach how we can implement this attitude, we can have meetings, etc., but also, regarding my specific occupation, it will not be enough ... There is a **physicality in some processes that cannot be digitized.**”



4 Key factors in the design of spaces

Well-being and Ergonomics

Promote people's **health and well-being** to build confidence and improve performance with ergonomic designs focused on comfort.



Organizational Culture

Understand and preserve brand spaces and culture to take advantage of their spaces and the **ways in which their employees and collaborators will relate.**



Quality and Environment

To guarantee the **maximum Quality, Safety and Environmental Respect** of the spaces, ensure that the designs, raw materials and other components comply with the highest international standards and certifications.



Sustainability

Furnishings must be manufactured with safe, **sustainable** materials with **long life cycles**. The furniture must be **flexible**, have multiple uses and be **reusable** in different areas.



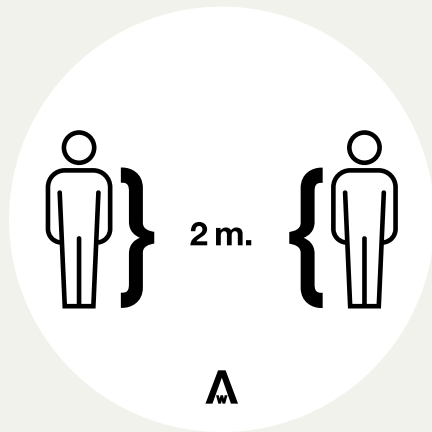
5 New design factors for the new needs

Physical distance

Now **health, safety** in spaces and **physical (social) distancing** have taken a leading role, affecting our routines, and architecture and interior design.

The post-Covid19 health implications in public spaces are reflected in these concepts:

Organize spaces to guarantee a minimum distance of 1.5 meters (5 feet) between the people occupying the space, including possible visitors.



- ▷ **Reduce the density of people.** Separate workstations and modify the distribution so that tasks and work processes can be planned.
- ▷ It must be ensured that the **interpersonal distance is guaranteed in the common** areas and stagger schedules.
- ▷ **Minimize contact between workers and clients or the public**, including in the waiting areas, to uphold interpersonal distance.
- ▷ Facilitate teleworking and meetings by **phone or videoconference, even in the same workspace, if there are no spaces.**
- ▷ The rise of **digitization** will help maintain these measures, staying more connected than ever, despite the distancing.

Cleaning and hygiene

Cleaning and practices must be planned and clearly and visually communicated together with personal hygiene advice for people and furniture. These will be some of the guidelines:



- ▷ **Use of physical barriers** such as protective panels or screens in places where physical separation is not possible, increases the protection of employees and visitors.
- ▷ **Workstations** must be **clear**, to facilitate the work of the cleaning staff when the space is abandoned.
- ▷ **Avoid using spaces and devices of other workers.** If necessary, increase precautionary measures by disinfecting them before use.
- ▷ **Reinforcement of cleaning** tasks in all rooms, with special emphasis on surfaces, especially those that are touched more frequently, as well as all the devices commonly used by employees, from machinery controls to tables, chairs and computers.

Social Responsability

One of the most effective measures and at the same time easiest to implement, lies in **responsibility** for our behaviors following the necessary individual and collective sanitary and hygiene measures, in addition to encouraging and normalizing the use of masks.



- ▷ Following **sanitary measures**, highlighting the **use of masks**, reducing physical contact and staying home when experiencing any symptoms, are crucial, and multiplies their effectiveness if we all implement them at the same time.
- ▷ Creating **alternative entry, exit, and internal movement schedules** can help reduce gathering. Starting times should be staggered to avoid crowds at the workplace entrance and exit.

- Enabling new spaces and new uses, including working from home.
- Furniture properties and characteristics.
